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Important notes:

- 1. A maximum of 8 courses or 48 units of credit will be granted towards the ANU program.
- 2. Students will not receive credit for courses they have not completed or studied upon commencement at ANU and must achieve a minimum grade of 70% or greater, where 60% is pass, in each course for which they wish to seek credit for. If a student does not meet this requirement for a course, they will not receive credit for that particular course.
- 3. The credit schedule only apply for students completing Capital Markets and Asian Capital Markets Major under the Bachelor of Finance. Students interested in completing the Quantitative Finance major should seek study plan advice before applying for credit.
- 4. Where more than one CUFE course is equal to one or more ANU courses, students must take all courses specified in order to receive the full credit.
- 5. All applicants must meet ANU admissions requirements, including English Language Requirements, provided at https://www.anu.edu.au/study/apply/international-applications-undergraduate-and-postgraduate.
- 6. If a student is granted credit for previous studies, it will reduce the number of courses (units) required in the selected degree program at ANU. Any credit received will impact upon the choice of course/ subject choices within ANU programs.
- 7. It is the responsibility of the student to check when specific courses are offered at the ANU and to change their program study plan accordingly. More details can be found at https://programsandcourses.anu.edu.au.
- 8. It's strongly recommended that students attend Orientation Week or meet with an academic adviser to confirm their program study plan when commencing their studies at the ANU.
- 9. The above arrangements are correct as at December 2021. Any changes to CUFE curriculum may lead to changes to credit arrangement.
- 10. Students are required to complete the relevant credit application process to the college during the enrolment period. Each application for credit will be assessed on an individual basis and the College will make the final decision as to the student's eligibility for credit.
